



1) Volume of trade between Estonia and the euro area (in euro million)






3) World export market shares (in volumes, 1994=100)


4) World export market shares for selected euro area countries (1998=100)




6) Physical capital/labour ratios (index, US=100, 1999)


7) Stocks of inward FDI in the CEE countries

(as percentage of GDP)



8) Share in extra-euro area trade (in %)




9) Employment rates in the euro area (in %)

(as percentages of GDP)







12) Regulatory burden of goods and services market





13) Youth unemployment in the euro area economies in 2006 (unemployment as % of the labour force)





14) Employment protection legislation index on temporary contracts




