EURO AREA INVESTMENT FUND STATISTICS APRIL 2011

In April 2011, the amount outstanding of shares/units issued by euro area investment funds other than money market funds was EUR 34 billion higher than in March 2011. This increase was due mainly to net issues of shares/units

The amount outstanding of shares/units issued by euro area investment funds other than money market funds increased to EUR 5,790 billion in April 2011, from EUR 5,756 billion in March 2011. Over the same period, the amount outstanding of shares/units issued by euro area money market funds decreased to EUR 1,071 billion from EUR 1,077 billion.

Transactions¹ in shares/units issued by euro area investment funds other than money market funds amounted to EUR 26 billion in April 2011, while transactions in shares/units issued by money market funds amounted to EUR 6 billion.

The annual growth rate of shares/units issued by euro area investment funds other than money market funds, calculated on the basis of transactions, was 4.4% in April 2011, while the annual rate of change of shares/units issued by euro area money market funds was -6.6%.

In terms of the **breakdown by investment policy**, the annual growth rate of shares/units issued by bond funds was 5.5% in April 2011. Transactions in shares/units issued by bond funds amounted to

¹ Transactions in shares/units issued mainly reflect the difference between shares/units issued and those redeemed, but may also include other transactions, such as those resulting from dividend payments received or distributed by the fund.

EUR 6 billion in April 2011. The annual growth rate and transactions of equity funds were 2.9% and EUR 12 billion respectively. For mixed funds, the corresponding figures were 5.8% and EUR 5 billion.

Notes

- Money market funds are presented separately in this press release since they are classified in the monetary
 financial institutions sector within the European statistical framework, while other types of investment fund
 are classified in the other financial intermediaries sector.
- In addition to the data for the reference month, this press release incorporates revisions to the data for previous periods.

¹⁾ Annual percentage changes are calculated on the basis of transactions.

²⁾ The breakdown by investment policy is generally based on the types of asset in which the investment funds primarily invest, usually on the basis of a stated strategy (e.g. if the fund primarily invests in shares and other equity it is allocated to the "equity funds" category). Funds investing in both equity and bonds, without any prevalent policy for either, are allocated to the "mixed funds" category. Hedge funds are classified in line with the statistical definition set out in Guideline ECB/2007/9. In particular, they cover funds with relatively unconstrained investment strategies and few restrictions on the types of financial asset in which they may invest. If a fund cannot be classified as an equity, bond, mixed, real estate or hedge fund, it is included in the strategies and tew restrictions on the types of financial asset in which they may hivest. It a fund cannot be classified as an equity, boind, finited, real est residual "other funds" category.

3) The shares/units of open-end funds can be redeemed out of the fund's assets. Closed-end funds are funds with a fixed number of issued shares/units.
